WHEREAS, *the ties between the German Chemical Society and the American Chemical Society offer many opportunities for the two societies to collaborate for mutual benefit;*

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, *that the Board of Directors of the American Chemical Society, recognizing the efforts of the German Chemical Society to strengthen the chemical enterprise, and anticipating opportunities for the two Societies to continue to work together to achieve their common goals, extends its congratulations to the Society in celebration the 150th anniversary of its founding organization, the Deutsche Chemische Gesellschaft zu Berlin.*
